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Hepatitis among the Homeless Attracts Attention, June 2012

Brief Primary Care Interventions Can Curb Risky Drug Use

United Press International, Science Codex, MedicalXpress, UCLA Newsroom Oct. 16, 2015, Health Canal Oct. 17, PsychCentral Oct. 18, Medical News Today Oct. 19 reported on research led by Dr. Lillian Gelberg finding that a few minutes of counseling in a primary care setting could help steer people away from risky drug use and possibly full-fledged addiction. Big News Network carried the UPI story. Gelberg is a professor of family medicine at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA and of public health at the UCLA Fielding School of Public Health.

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
